CHCs provide primary health care, health promotion and community services, using teams of health care providers such as physicians, nurse practitioners, nurses, dietitians, health promoters and others paid by salary rather than through a fee-for-service basis. There are currently more than 50 CHCs in Ontario, but none in our community.
