OUR INTERNATIONAL OUTREACH PROJECT: Teachers' Brigade to Honduras - Rev. Lynda Hodgins, Marie Press, Cathie Morrissey, Marj Smith and Karin Robinson, all teachers from the Lindsay and Peterborough areas, will travel into the mountains of Honduras to visit the one- or two- room schools hidden among the hills from April 8 to 18, 2010. As well as demonstrate and model some lessons, they will bring with them school supplies such as Spanish books, flashcards, craft supplies, pencils, crayons, markers and first-aid kits. Possible other projects are upgrading the latrines, replacing roof tiles with transparent sheets to allow sunlight to light the room, since there are no electric lights, and adding some rudimentary furniture. Often the lunch meal that the children eat at school is the only meal they will eat that day, so purchasing flour, sugar, salt and rice to leave at the schools would be our wish. If we may be as bold as to ask and if you would be so kind to help, we would like to purchase Spanish books for children aged 6 to 16 years. To help us do that, we hope that you will donate \$10.00 to buy a book. In exchange, you will be given a book label to sign with a name of your choosing that we will adhere to a book once we are at a school in Honduras. We will take photographs of the children receiving their books to share with you and we will be sure to tell them of your generosity. **Labels will be available before and after the Sunday services from January 31 to February 28th inclusive.** Your help is needed and greatly appreciated.
